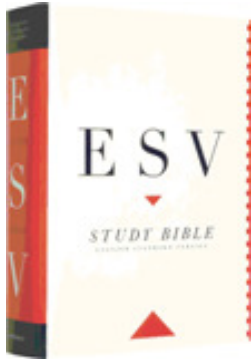

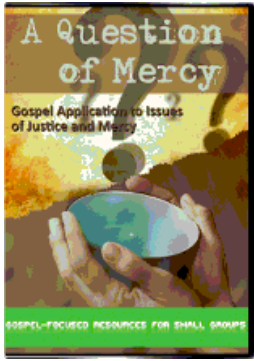

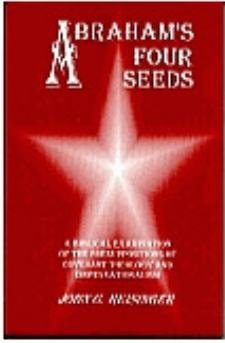

Abraham's Four Seeds

John G. Reisinger

Abraham's Four Seeds is a biblical examination of the presuppositions of Covenant Theology and Dispensationalism.

Pastor, evangelist, and author John G. Reisinger demonstrates how a correct understanding of "Abraham's seeds" is key to harmonizing Scripture. He writes:

The following statement, if correctly understood, will help to clear up a lot of confusion: The nation of Israel was not the 'Body of Christ,' even though the Body of Christ is indeed the true 'Israel of God.' Covenant Theology cannot accept the first part of that statement and Dispensationalism cannot accept the second part. The basic presuppositions of Covenant Theology make it mandatory that Israel be the church and be under the same covenant as the church, and the one thing a Dispensationalist must maintain is the church's present and future distinction from Israel which makes it mandatory that Israel and the church can never be under the same covenant or inherit the same blessings. What is essential to one system is anathema to the other system. Dispensationalism cannot get Israel and the church together in any sense whatever, and Covenant Theology cannot get them apart.

Dispensationalism cannot see that the church is the true Israel of God and the fulfillment of the promises that God made to Abraham and the fathers, and Covenant Theology cannot see that the church, as the Body of Christ, did not, and simply could not, exist in reality and experience until the personal advent of the Holy Spirit on the Day of Pentecost. Dispensationalism insists that Israel and the church have totally different promises and destinies (one earthly and the other heavenly), and Covenant Theology insists that Israel and the Body of Christ are equally the "same redeemed church under the same 'covenant of grace' and governed by the same identical 'canon of conduct.'"

Dispensationalism drives a wedge between the OT and the NT and never the twain shall meet as specific promise (OT) and identical fulfillment (NT); and Covenant Theology flattens the whole Bible out into one covenant where there is no real and vital distinction between either the Old and New Covenants or Israel and the church. The Old Covenant proved one's guilt and forbade one to draw near without a perfect righteousness or an acceptable sacrifice. The New Covenant declares a believer to be both righteous and acceptable in God's sight, and it bids him come boldly without fear into the very Most Holy place that was totally closed off to all but Aaron under the Old Covenant. The law as a legal covenant ended when the veil of the temple was rent from top to bottom, and the law as a pedagogue over the conscience was dismissed on the day of Pentecost when the 'promise of the Father' took up his abode in every believer as the personal Vicar of the ascended Lord. The giving of the Spirit is the proof of the accepted work of Christ in the heavenly tabernacle, and the 'given Spirit' indwelling the believer is the indelible assurance of our eternal acceptance by the Father. It is the author's desire that this book would be of benefit to those who desire to understand "What does the Scripture say?" May the watchword *Sola Scriptura* have real meaning in the church!

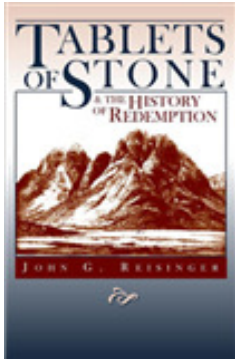

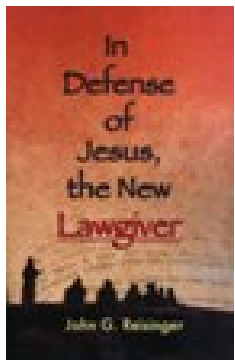

In Defense of Jesus, the New Lawgiver

John G. Reisinger

This book has a two-fold purpose.

First, it is a response to a series of challenges to New Covenant Theology that Dr. Richard Barcellos offered in his book titled *In Defense of the Decalogue*. The challenges were made to anyone holding to New Covenant Theology in general and to me personally. Dr. Barcellos's book is written in an irenic spirit and will prove to be very helpful in the present discussion in Reformed circles on the relationship of the Old and New Covenants. I sincerely hope this response is just as irenic and helpful.

The second purpose of this book is to set forth what New Covenant Theology actually does believe in the eight areas where Barcellos states his objections.

The titles of both books tell the whole story. Barcellos is defending the view that the Decalogue, or "words of the covenant," written on the stone tablets of the covenant (Exodus 34:27, 28) are the highest expression of the Law of God ever given.

We believe the New Covenant revelation given to us by Christ and His apostles is a higher and more demanding law than anything given through Moses. Simply stated, this book asserts that Jesus is a new and higher Lawgiver who replaces Moses in exactly the same way he replaces Aaron as high priest. Barcellos insists that Christ is the greatest exegete of the Law of God given to Moses but in no sense gives any higher or more demanding law than Moses. We believe Christ is not only a Lawgiver but he is the full and final Lawgiver who supersedes and replaces all others.

This is the eighteenth title in print by John G. Reisinger. He lives in New York with his wife Rosemary.

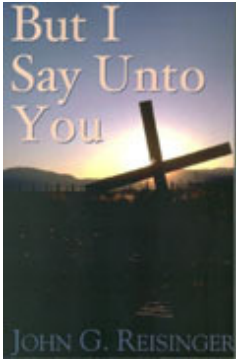

But I say unto You

John G. Reisinger

Our Lord used the phrase, But I say unto you, six times in the Sermon on the Mount. The meaning of this phrase as he used it in Matthew 5 is the subject of disagreement among many sincere Christians. Evangelical theologians generally adopt one of two possible interpretations: One, Christ is contrasting his teaching with Moses' teaching; or two, Christ is giving the true meaning of Moses and contrasting that with the distortions of Moses by the Pharisees. Which of these positions is correct? The answer we accept directly affects our entire system of theology.

This is no ivory tower debate among academics far removed from the life of the church and individual Christians. Its crucial point addresses the identity and content of the final authority over the Christian's conscience in matters of morality.

The thesis of this book is one of the foundation stones of a theological position called New Covenant Theology. We believe that our Lord is more than a scribe or rabbi who merely interprets Moses; he is a true prophet. He is "that Prophet," promised as the new lawgiver who would replace Moses (Deut. 18:15-19). In the Sermon on the Mount, the new lawgiver contrasts his teaching, based on the gracious covenant he established, with the teaching of Moses, based on a covenant of law.

As believers living under the New Covenant, we must look to Jesus Christ as the final revelation of God's character and will, and allow him alone to set the standards that mark the life of the people of God. We must take seriously the Father's message, "This is my Son, whom I love. Listen to him" (Mark 9:7).

Biblical Law and Ethics: Absolute and covenantal

Gary D. Long

Biblical law revealed in the Old Testament canon of the law and the prophets is both absolute and covenantal. It is absolute law in the sense that no part of the whole Old Testament Scripture shall escape being fulfilled by Christ. As covenant law every "jot and tittle" of the law or the prophets will be brought to full realization in the Messianic mission of Christ. This occurs under the New Covenant administration of God's eternal purpose. Mathew 5:17-20 is the central passage when Jesus declares His covenantal abrogation of the law or the prophets and where He affirms the absolute and unchanging standard of ethical righteousness for entrance into the kingdom of heaven. Indeed, later New Testament teaching and application of biblical law and ethics for the New Covenant believer stems from and builds upon the contextual exegesis of Matthew 5:17-20. The book provides an exegetical answer to the teaching of Theonomy on the law of God with application to the traditional understanding of the text by Reformed Theology.

Gary D. Long is the Faculty President of Providence Theological Seminary in Colorado Springs, CO (www.ptsco.org) and the Executive Director of Sovereign Grace Ministries. He holds degrees from the University of Missouri (B.S. in Agriculture, 1959) and from Dallas Theological Seminary (Th.M. in Systematic Theology, 1969; Th.D. in Historical Theology, 1972). He worked as a church planter while serving in the U.S. Army and retired as a Field Artillery Colonel in 1989. His published books include *Definite Atonement*, *The Doctrine of Salvation*, and *Context! Evangelical Views on the Millennium Examined*.

CONTEXT! Evangelical Views on the Millennium Examined

Gary D. Long

CONTEXT! is a book written to enhance biblical unity regarding Bible prophecy by getting back to the Bible. It is written specifically as a one-volume textbook for Bible teachers and Bible College and Seminary students who desire to study the word of God. It focuses upon an examination of American Evangelicalism and its diverse systems and teaching on the millennium as indicated by the subtitle Evangelical Views on the Millennium Examined. The book is the result of intermittent studies over 35 years. Some 15 variations of prophetic interpretations relating to the millennial issue are addressed as taught within two basic systems of theology: Dispensational Theology and Reformed or Covenant Theology.

There are five major prophetic teachings that stem from these two basic systems. Each is explained by lengthy firsthand-citations from acknowledged representative scholarly proponents. The five major teachings are then summarized, examined and questioned in light of five New Testament doctrinal maxims that the author believes are firmly supported by the context of Scripture. The author then presents an alternate way to interpret the doctrine of the last things that he calls New Covenant Non-Premillennialism. This is accomplished by explaining: (1) the biblical context and the significance of the biblical doctrine of Spirit baptism within a redemptive history framework; and (2) the importance of the "Now-Not Yet" principle of biblical interpretation.

Over time the author believes that the book may cause many teachers and students to rethink their prophetic beliefs objectively by reexamining their interpretative presuppositions in view of the context of Holy Writ. The book concludes with a prophecy questionnaire that highlights the variations present within evangelicalism today that too often hinder the gospel of Christ. Providing a partial solution to this hindrance is the motivating cause for writing CONTEXT!

Gary D. Long is Executive Director of Sovereign Grace Ministries, Inc. He holds degrees from the University of Missouri (B.S. in Agriculture, 1959) and from Dallas Theological Seminary (Th.M. in Systematic Theology, 1969; Th.D. in Historical Theology, 1972). 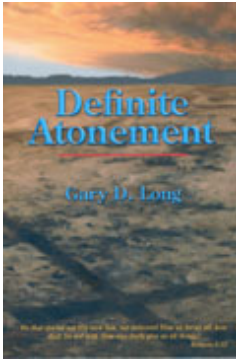

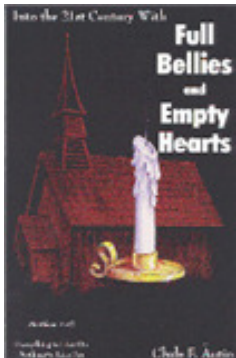

Some years past, Sound of Grace carried an article by John G. Reisinger entitled “Grace.” This article—now expanded into this book—profoundly affected the way I viewed grace and indeed God’s work in the salvation and sanctification of sinners such as me. No longer restricted in my understanding by the traditional definition, I came to see that grace has more than one aspect; indeed, it has many facets.

First, I came to appreciate much more fully and deeply just how free (no merit on the part of rebellious sinners) grace as given by the sovereign God truly is. If you struggle with understanding how to keep the Sabbath, this booklet will be of great help.

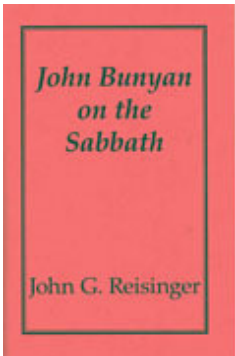

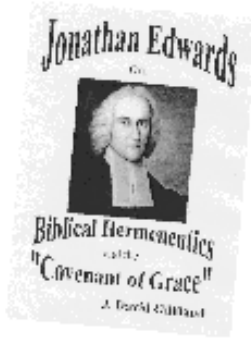

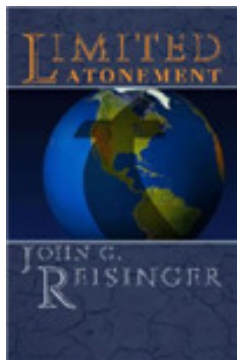

John G. In this book, the fourth in his series on the "Doctrines of Grace," John sets forth the doctrine of the atonement, and examines the two prevailing Evangelical views concerning it. The necessity and the nature of the atonement are presented in clear terms, along with a concise exploration of the biblical terms, ransom, substitute, reconciliation, and propitiation. The concepts of imputation and representation are considered and applied to the topic, and the objections to the teaching of Particular Redemption are fairly answered. Included in the book are two Appendices: the first asks the question, "What did Christ accomplish in his death on the cross? Did his death make salvation possible for all men, or did his death make salvation certain for the elect?" John presents a chart that compares the answers of Free-Will with the answers of Free-Grace. The second appendix contains an excellent exposition of Romans 5:12-19, which carefully follows the Apostle Paul's use of the words many and all. The First London Confession of Faith-1646 Edition

Preface by Gary D Long

Why reprint the 1646 edition of "The First London Baptist Confession of Faith" with the Appendix by Benjamin Cox also written in 1646?

There are a number of reasons why, aside from the need to make it readily available. There are three main reasons.

First, these two documents exalt Christ in a brief, articulate and biblical manner. They summarize the belief of many present-day Sovereign Grace Baptists and others who do not use the appellation of "Baptist" but are baptistic in their doctrine of the Church and its ordinances.

Second and most significantly, there is a distinctive New Covenant emphasis concerning Biblical law in these two 1646 documents that is distinctly lacking in the Old Covenant emphasis of the "Westminster Confession of Faith" (approved and ratified in 1647-1649) and its baptistic modification in "The Second London Confession of 1689" (including its American version, "The Philadelphia Confession of Faith," adopted in 1742).

Third, from a credal standpoint it is hoped, for the glory of our Triune God, that these two 1646 documents will help break down the "middle walls of doctrinal partition" that exist among those holding to the "Doctrines of grace."

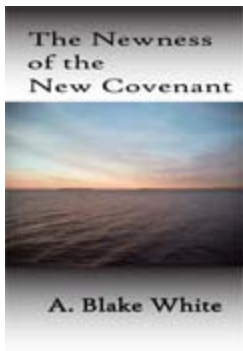

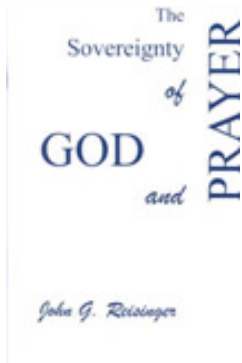

Prayer is earnestly pleading with God for grace to glorify him regardless of what he does. We are really saying, "Father, give me grace to trust you and act like your child whether you say yes or no."

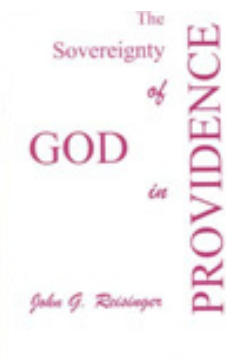

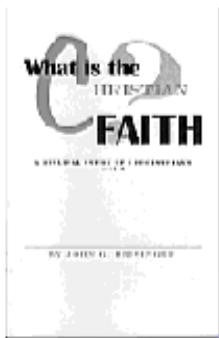
